INSPIRATION

ICE BREAKER

1. Who in your life has been a model of deep devotion to God?
 2. What do you think a life fully devoted to God looks like?
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DEEP DIVE

Read this out loud

An excerpt from the message this week:

“ Faith is...Being sure of what we hope for. Faith is not wishful thinking – that is usually how we view faith – well I sure hope so – I hope that God is real – I hope that there is a heaven – I hope I get to go there – I hope there is not a hell – I hope that I don't go there. Faith is not that. Faith is being absolutely certain that what we believe is true and will come to pass. It is with conviction that we look forward and trust in God. Therefore, this faith determines how I live no matter what.”

Read Luke 2:25-38 and then answer the following questions:



3. After reading Luke 2:25-38, how would you characterize Anna and Simeon?
4. What do you learn about the baby Jesus from this passage?
5. How could you, like Anna, live out your life in worshiping God and sharing about Jesus?

Read this out loud

An excerpt from the message this week:

“Your friends are waiting for someone who will tell them about what they have seen and heard. That is what Anna did – this is what I have seen. You can do that too – here is what I know – here is what Jesus has done for me – come with me – it is – he is real. You might not have all the answers to their questions – but you know them – well enough to tell your story – your faith journey – I once was lost and now I am found journey.”

Read Isaiah 40:1-5, James 1:27, Acts 1:8 and then answer the following questions:

6. Read Isaiah 40:1-5 and determine how we are to comfort people according to these verses. How do you tie comforting others with the gospel of Jesus?
7. Read James 1:27. According to this verse what is pure religion? Notice pure religion requires us not to be corrupted and to help widows and orphans. Pastor Mark noted two things we can do to help others which includes being present in their lives and listening. What are some ways to be present in other people’s lives and listen?
8. Read Acts 1:8. Anna told anyone who would listen about Jesus. What is the role of the Holy Spirit in sharing about Jesus according to this verse? What is the Spirit’s role in your life and others when sharing about Jesus?
